

We focus our mission on novice hunters with an interest in forging a connection between conservation hunting and sustainable eating. As land stewards, we know the many challenges of participating in traditional outdoor activities and aim to break down those barriers for our fellow Texans.

Hunts are typically 3 days/2 nights and consist of firearms training and safety, harvest shot placement, field dressing/butchering techniques, and a personal mentor that will be with each hunter throughout the hunt.
